

Dear friends and lovers of Israel,

In this newsletter update, we are presenting a change to how My Brother's Keeper International operates. To begin with, I would like to present to you our new mission statement that reflects how we are adapting to the ever-changing landscape of Israel at war.

But first, allow me to describe the present situation that has caused us to shift.

Situation Report

As of this writing, over 100,000 Israeli citizens are displaced within their own country. Thousands of our regular army and reserve soldiers have been wounded, many struggling to re-enter their lives after intense combat in the Gaza strip.

The destruction of the remaining Hamas battalions in the Gaza Strip is not completed. The terror war in Judea and Samaria is not represented in the media or your social media. Yet the IDF and Border Police have been fighting for over 10 months.

Two divisions of regular army and reserve soldiers are deployed on Israel's northern border with Lebanon training and waiting for the government to give the green light to change the paradigm of Oct 8th 2023 from an Iranian/Hezbollah initiated war of attrition that has emptied the entire Galilee from Mt. Hermon to the Mediterranean sea to an invasion of southern Lebanon.

There are no tourists, and hotels are filled with internally displaced Israeli families. Small businesses - from the ma and pa grocery to mid-sized industries - are suffering. Everyone is ready for the proverbial shoe to drop. Will Hezbollah succeed in hitting key infrastructure in Haifa, Tel Aviv, Dimona? Will Iran send Iraqi, Afghani and Yeminite

jihadists to join Hezbollah's Radwan commandos invade the Galilee? The picture looks downright apocalyptic.

My Brother's Keeper International believes in the resilience of the Israeli people. We believe in the strength and determination of our armed forces. We believe in the love and support of our Jewish and Christian allies. We believe in the G-d of Israel.

There isn't a day that goes by when I don't struggle with melancholy from the loss we experienced on that Black Sabbath in October. I feel rage when I see the astronomical rise of anti-semitism across the globe and realize that everything has changed.

There is no turning the clock back. This is the new reality, and we are ready for whatever comes.

My Brother's Keeper International exists to build and strengthen the resilience of Israeli children, families and communities by developing innovative projects and subsidizing existing school and community-based programs throughout Israel.

Singer House Orphanage

The Singer House is one of the oldest orphanages in Israel and sits in Moshav Kfar Yehezkel in the Jezreel valley. The orphanage is home to 90 children from 5-18 years old.

MBKI's focus is to help the children who "age out" of the orphanage and become "lone soldiers." These teens move into secondary housing during their army service and have access to continued counseling and life skill training.

Since the war began, many of the Singer House teens have experienced combat related trauma and are in need of more extensive care. We are helping to provide this extended care.



The way we are restructuring allows us to distribute funds to our partners in a timely and efficient manner that meets practical needs in real time with fiscal accountability.
